The anthem "How Firm A Foundation" is given by the Sanctuary Choir to the glory of God, and in honor of Dr. Michael Williams, upon his retirement.

Music Participants: The Sanctuary Choir. Associate Minister of Music, Andrew Risinger is director and organist. Minister of Music, Matthew Phelps, is assisting at the organ.

Hymnic Notes: The processional is a hymn of praise to the ascended and reigning Christ. Each stanza is a lyrical elaboration on one of Christ's names: 1) the Lamb upon the throne; 2) the Virgin's Son; 3) the Lord of Love; 4) the Lord of Peace; 5) the Lord of Years; 6) the Lord of Heaven. The well constructed and stirring tune DIADEMATA (named after the Greek word for "crowns"), was composed for the text.

The words of the joyous recessional were composed to the unique metrical structure of the Welsh Harp tune LLWYN ONN (The Ash Gove), and together first appeared as a choral work. It is one of very few successful adaptations of the words and music of a choir anthem as a congregational hymn. (*Hymnic Notes by Carlton Young*)

June 25, 2017 **Preaching: Michael Williams** "The Greatest of These Is Love" 1 Corinthians 13: 1-13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.


