Hymnic Notes: Walter Chalmers Smith based the text for "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" on 1 Timothy 1:17. It was published in 1867 and was paired to the tune St. Denio in 1906 for the English Hymnal. "Take My Life, and Let it Be" is an example of Evangelical English hymnody due to focus on our relationship with God. Frances Havergal wrote the hymn following an experience of praying with unconverted people, all of whom converted by the end of their time together. (Hymnic Notes by Matthew Phelps)

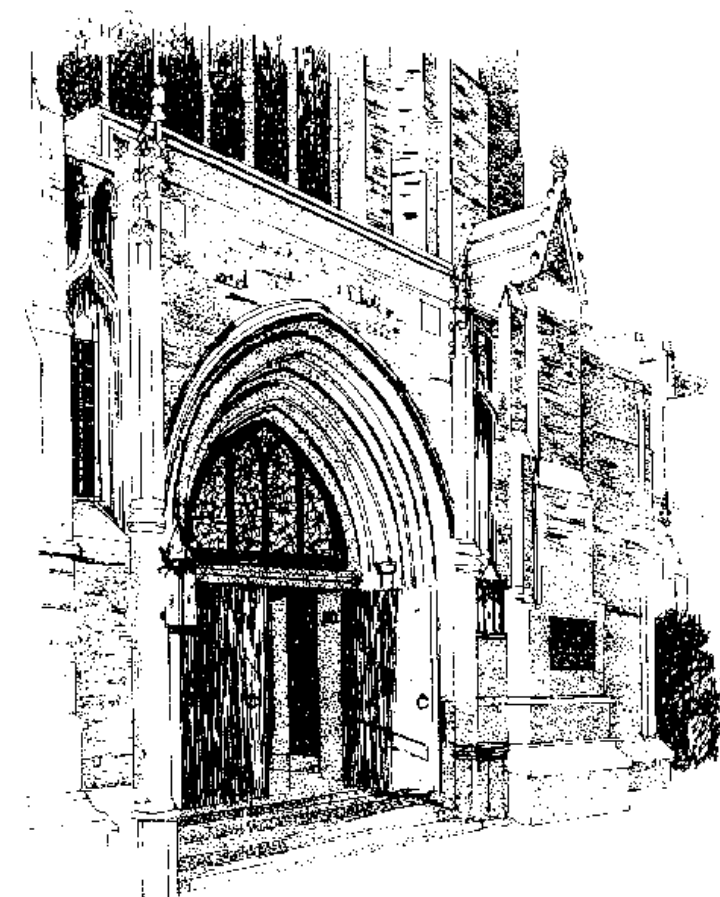
