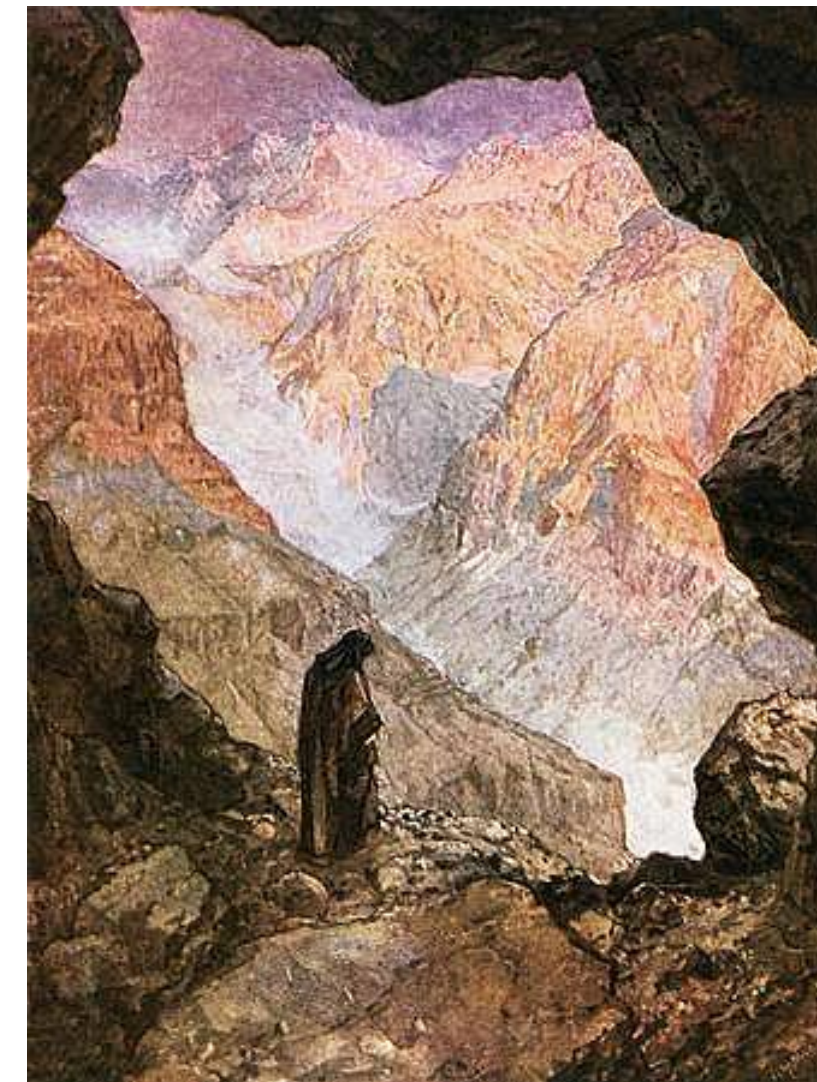
Project Transformation Reading Week
