OVERFLOW PARKING FOR CHRISTMAS AT WEST END UMC

Since our parking lot can fill up quickly at times, there is a parking garage available free-of-charge in the Caterpillar Financial Garage where you can park and walk over to West End UMC. We encouage you to utilize this option when possible, especially for our Christmas Eve servcies.

- Head east (toward downtown) on West End Ave.
- Turn left on to Louise Ave.
- Turn right on to Hayes Street and the garge entrance will be on your right.
- Use the intercom to be buzzed in by telling the guard you are with West End.
- ◆ Following worship, you will be able to re-enter the garage via the pedestrian door on Hayes Street using the intercom.
