



Today's Music

We Three Kings was written by John Henry Hopkins, Jr. in 1857. It was written for a Christmas Pageant held at General Theological Seminary in New York City where Hopkins served as the music teacher after his Diaconate graduation in 1850. The hymn was first published in 1862 and has subsequently been published by most major Christian denominations, making it one of the most widely known carols in the world.

Bulletin Cover Art

"Journey of the Magi," by the French artist James Jacques Joseph Tissot (1836-1902). Tissot's works include a wide variety of commissioned paintings of French aristocrats, but he also became intensely interested in Biblical subjects and produced many paintings of Old and New Testament characters and stories.
