**Today's Music** 

"The Summons" is set to the tune of *Kelvingrove*, a traditional Scottish melody. Its text contains thirteen questions asked by Jesus in the first person. The initial four stanzas with the questions are in Jesus' voice, and the fifth stanza is the singer's response to them. The hymn is based on Mark 1:16–20 and alludes to Jesus calling his disciples to follow him.

## **Bulletin Cover Art**

"Two Disciples" by Jesus Mafa a Christian group in Cameroon that, some years ago, were approached by a French Catholic missionary who helped them to create dramas and paintings of Biblical scenes using their own people as a way to teach them the stories of the Bible. The Vanderbilt University library has 63 of those paintings archived on their website. This one is of Jesus (always depicted in red in Jesus Mafa paintings) calling Philip and Nathanael to follow him. It was painted in 1973. We have used Jesus Mafa paintings for bulletin covers several times in recent years.
