



Today's Music

The tune for, "Come Christians, Join to Sing," was originally a parlor song that was arranged for piano by Benjamin Carr. In 1826, Carr's arrangement was published with the title, Spanish hymn arranged, and composed for Concerts of the Musical Fund Society of Philadelphia. It was republished as a hymn in 1827, implying that it was relatively well known at the time. (Carlton Young)

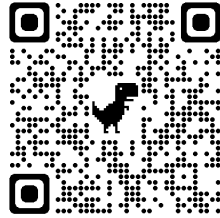
