Today's Music

Charles Wesley first published the text, "Christ, Whose Glory Fills the Skies," in *Hymns and Sacred Poems*, 1740. The text was included in a number of nineteenth century hymnals after being published in two other eighteenth century collections. The tune *Ratisbon* entered our hymnals in 1935 in the version found in Hymns Ancient and Modern.

"The Transformation of Jesus Christ," was painted in 2006 by Cornelis Monsma who grew up in The Netherlands with no art training but now lives in New Zealand and describes his work this way: "Like many other fellow Christians, I started out with a well-meaning attitude of 'wanting to do my part' for the Christ who gave so much for me. I ended up, however, finding 'me' wanting, and I found that Christ doing His part Himself through me, was the only fruitful situation to be in."

This organization exemplifies the emphasis on both mercy and justice by providing tangible goods that help keep people alive while experiencing homelessness, as well as walking with them to housing. They provide excellent training and advocate alongside those without homes in the halls of the legislature against laws that criminalize homelessness. West End has a special relationship through our sponsorship of one of their street outreach workers. This amazing individual knows folks experiencing chronic homelessness by going out to the places they stay. We have the ability to refer individuals to them and help their recently housed folks stay in housing with financial assistance.
