Over 100 million people living in America, one in three, struggle with the pressure of medical debt. Through our church member, Dr. Trey Harrell, we learned of an organization that can wipe out medical debt for pennies on the dollar. Just as health care is an industry, medical debt is a commodity and it is often sold by hospitals, doctors, and other health care businesses to third parties for pennies on the dollar. These third party companies can then try to collect this debt for profit.

RIP Medical Debt is a nonprofit organization that buys medical debt and then simply forgives it, reminding us of the instructions we are given in Deuteronomy 15: 1-2, 7-8, 11 to establish a year for canceling the debts of the most vulnerable.
